**Project overview:** The overall objective of CLAPs is to co-create interventions and metrics that enable successful adaptation to climate change. CLAPs examines existing local climate change adaptation action in Indian cities and rapidly changing rural areas. The project analyses these actions against current development priorities to help evaluate adaptation pathways that can meet the goals of climate-resilient, migrant-friendly development. The project creates a set of generalised lessons and evaluative metrics with action partners to provide guidelines and improve policies on climate adaptation based on experiences in India.
